EVERYVET'S LEAGUE GOES DIGITAL

You may notice that in the heading I have included a new web address next to the traditional Everyman's web address. This is the link to our new stand-alone EveryVet's website! This website is something that I created so that we could reach out specifically to the veteran community online, and so that we could share more what the EveryVet's League is all about. We also have photos and videos posted to the site, and we plan to keep expanding it as we develop this important work in the future. As well as the creation of the website, we have begun having online meetings too. This began of course because of the lock downs, but as we began to meet online to encourage one another and catch up, I felt that we should meet with more of a purpose. Out of that we began what we are calling 'EveryVet's Connect Group'. This group is a Bible study and fellowship, which meets weekly, both online and in person at our home. The idea is that we encourage those who can come to our house and those who cannot to join us via video call. This means that no matter where someone is around the world, they can join in with us. It also means that when I am away out bush, I can log in remotely and still participate. We have been studying through the book of Matthew and the format of our meetings is start off with an opening prayer, singing of some songs, then reading the chapter and then discussion of the passage. At the end we have a time of prayer where we can bring prayer requests. We also have people come for dinner beforehand and about once a month we will have a group dinner and breaking of bread/communion together. I know it has been a blessing particularly for one of our Everyman's Reps – Leanne, who was stuck in lockdown in Melbourne and unable to attend church at all for months. For her it was the only real fellowship that she had. We are planning to keep the meetings going permanently.







EVERYVET'S MEETINGS

EveryVet's Conference with Chaplain Haydn Parsons

2020 was a year that saw me focusing a lot more on the EveryVet's side of the ministry especially in the second half of the year. As the lockdowns eased in Queensland and we were able to meet in person, an opportunity arose for us to apply for a grant from the Department of Veterans affairs to hold an event. I applied and got the grant which enabled us to hold the very first Everyman's Veterans League conference. I invited Chaplain Haydn Parsons who has been a friend of mine for several years. Haydn runs a workshop and has written a book of the same title called 'Keeping Yourself S.A.F.E.R.'. I was invited to one of his workshops that was put on for one of the Army units at Gallipoli Barracks. I was impressed by the workshop, so it made sense to have him come and present to our Veterans. With the funding that we received we organised for a food caterer to come and provide a lunch. The lunch ended up being a gourmet feast and there was so much food left over that we practically had to beg for people to take the leftovers! We also had the whole day filmed, which I was able to create videos so that anyone can view the conference and benefit from the wonderful advice given on the day.





Uganda Mission Presentation

During the year Petri, who together with his wife Katja, Claudia and I went to Uganda and Finland with, gave a presentation on Kamuge Missions International, the project and NGO that we are involved in together. The presentation went over much of the history of Uganda, the challenges and difficulties that we faced working in Uganda, but also the miracles that the Lord has done in that project. It gave us the opportunity to share our desire to eventually take teams of Veterans over there to help with the various projects that we have going there. The possibility of a trip to Uganda under the EveryVet's was a well-received idea and we have had some expressions of interest already. The idea has a twofold effect, namely, that the people of Uganda would receive help and the Veterans who go will have the benefit of having a purpose to help others in a much poorer condition. Whether or not we can make this plan eventuate is up to the Lord. Now that Covid is a factor in this world, it certainly makes things much more challenging. Already we have not been able to return to Uganda as we had planned and as of this time the only support we can give to our people is prayer and financial.
