When I came back they were both ecstatic about the same message coming to them from two different people in a short time and I told them the God sent that man because they both needed to be born again! This man invited them to come to his church which happened to be in the same neighbourhood that Ryan lives in! Jonathan mentioned that his wife was also reading the Bible but finding it difficult because of the English when suddenly we met Gina (pictured right) who was also a Filipino and a Christian too and she gave a Filipino Bible to Jonathan and also invited them to come to the church and Bible study that she was attending and it turns out to be in the same neighbourhood that Jonathan lives in! I have kept in touch with both of them and continue to encourage them in the faith via Facebook and I pray that they will both continue to follow the Lord! I also had the opportunity to attend Gina's church which was a beautiful home church.

Sharper Than a Two Edged Sword



In my last update I mentioned Rey and his church and how they visit the communities of the workers who come to Dubai from all over the world. These workers live in pretty difficult conditions and are not treated the best so Rey's church goes and visits them bringing food and conducting Bible studies with whoever will come. Rey mentioned to me that Bibles were very expensive to purchase in the U.A.E. and initially Claudia sent over some Bibles that were not being used. My brother in the Lord, Juan-Pierre or J.P. for short is currently doing his degree at Bible college in Australia and as a

part of his course he received a \$400 voucher for an online bookshop in Sydney to buy Christian paperback books to add to his library. However, J.P. is legally blind and cannot read fine print (he mainly uses Kindle on the computer because he can zoom right in and read) so he had no use for paperback books. He came up with an idea to buy Bibles instead and have them sent over to give to Rey's church. Initially the idea was rejected by the bookshop but after explaining the situation the managers took the idea to the

considering the proposal they agreed to do it just this once. The problem was that it was getting close to the end of my trip and the postal system can sometimes take a long time for things to arrive but our God has all things under His control! The books arrived about four days before I left and I was able to hand over the Bibles to Rey before leaving! He received with much gratitude and after arriving back in Australia he sent me some photos of the Bibles being handed out to some of the workers that they went to visit (picture bottom right).
